### Contestant Entry Divisions:

- Youth—18 years old or younger
- Adult—Over 18 years old

Every contestant receives 1 Cup of shelled pecans

### All Entries:

- Must include 1 cup or more of pecans
- Must be in a disposable dish, and covered with clear plastic wrap.
- Must be accompanied with the recipe, neatly printed or typed.
- Must have name, address, and telephone number of contestant printed on the back of the recipe.

### Entry Classes:

No entries requiring refrigeration can be accepted. (No whipped cream, cream cheese, including cream cheese icing and cheese cakes.)

- Cakes (no cream cheese icing or fillings)
- Candy (2 1/2 dozen or a full recipe)
- Cookies (2 1/2 dozen or a full recipe)
- Bars (2 1/2 dozen or a full recipe)
- Pies (no cream cheese, pudding/custard filling)
- Quick Breads

### Arrivals:

Entries are due between 8:00 am—9:30 am, Sat., October 24, at The Big Red Barn.

### Judging:

Judging begins at 9:30 am, Sat., Oct. 24

### Awards:

- Youth and Adult 1st place class winners in each entry class receive \$15
- Class winners compete for overall Grand & Reserve Champion
  - Youth and Adult Grand Champion receive \$50
  - Youth and Adult Reserve Champions receive \$35
- Award Ribbons and cash awards may be picked up at The Big Red Barn after 4 pm, Sat., Oct. 24.
